

## Plaid Porch Pillow

## (Plum/green colourway)

This cosy pillow is simplicity itself to make and the perfect companion to the Plaid Porch Quilt - see tildasworld.com for the quilt instructions. There is also a pillow in a smart red and blue colourway. The pillow only uses small amounts of the fabrics and if you have made the quilt, you may have some fabric left over.

- Fabric 1: one $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ square - Eden moss (100476)
- Fabric 2: two $3 ½$ in ( 9 cm ) squares - Berrytangle sage (100479)
- Fabric 3: three $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares - Friendly Gathering fern (100478)
- Fabric 4: two $31 / 2$ in ( 9 cm ) squares - Elanora teal (100477)
- Fabric 5: four $3 ½$ in ( 9 cm ) squares - Applegarden pine (100480)
- Fabric 6: one $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ square - Friendly Gathering plum (100475)
- Fabric 7: one $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ square - Elanora grape (100474)
- Fabric 8: three $31 / 2 \mathrm{in}(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares - Applegarden plum (100471)
- Fabric 9: two $31 / 2$ in ( 9 cm ) squares - Berrytangle plum (100472)
- Fabric 10: one $31 / 2 \mathrm{in}(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ square - Eden grape (100473)
- Fabric 11: two $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares - My Neighbourhood lilac (110062)
- Fabric 12: two $3 ½$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares - My Neighbourhood moss (110063)
- Fabric 13: six $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares and three $31 / 2$ in $\times 61 / 2$ in rectangles - Solid warm sand (120002)
- Fabric 14: four $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares and two $31 / 2$ in $\times 61 / 2$ in rectangles - Solid blue sage (120008)
- Fabric 15: two $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ squares and one $3^{1 / 2}$ in $\times 61 / 2$ in rectangle - Solid lavender pink (120010)
- Fabric 16: two $3 ½$ in ( 9 cm ) squares - Chambray Dot mauve (160055)
- Fabric 17: four 3½in (9cm) squares - Chambray Dot denim (160057)
- Wadding (batting): 29in x 20 in ( $73.6 \mathrm{~cm} \times 50.8 \mathrm{~cm}$ )
- Lining fabric (optional): 29 in $\times 20 \mathrm{in}$ ( $73.6 \mathrm{~cm} \times 50.8 \mathrm{~cm}$ )
- Fabric for back of pillow: $7 / 8 y d(80 \mathrm{~cm})$ - Chambray Dot denim (160057)
- Binding fabric: $1 / 4 y d(25 \mathrm{~cm})$ - Solid dusty teal (120043)
- Five buttons for pillow fastening (optional) - Hometown $3 / 4$ in ( 18 mm ) diameter (400048)
- Piecing and quilting threads
- Quilter's ruler, rotary cutter and mat
- Pillow pad to fit cover

## General Notes

- Fabric quantities are based on a usable width of $42 \mathrm{in}(107 \mathrm{~cm})$, unless otherwise stated.
- Measurements are in imperial inches with metric conversions in brackets - use only one system throughout (preferably inches).
- Width measurements are generally given first.
- Press all fabrics before cutting.
- Use $1 / 4 \mathrm{in}(6 \mathrm{~mm})$ seams unless otherwise instructed.
- Read all the instructions through before you start.


## Pillow Layout and Cutting Out

1 The quilt uses just two patches - a square cut $31 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ and a rectangle cut $31 / 2$ in $\times 61 / 2$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm} \times 16.5 \mathrm{~cm})$. See Fig A for the fabrics used and Fig B for the layout and positions of the fabrics.

2 The squares and rectangles needed are given in the Materials list.
3 Cut the fabric for the back of the pillow into two pieces, each $12 \mathrm{in} \times 271 / 2$ in $(30.5 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ 70 cm ).

4 Cut the binding fabric into three strips $21 / 2$ in $(6.4 \mathrm{~cm}) \mathrm{x}$ width of fabric. Sew them together end to end and press seams open. Press in half along the length, wrong sides together.

## Sewing the Patchwork

$\mathbf{5}$ Lay out all the pieces as shown in Fig B. Sew the pieces together into columns, as shown in
Fig C, pressing the seams of columns 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9 downwards and the seams of columns $2,4,6$, and 8 upwards. Now sew the columns together, matching up seams neatly. Press seams in one direction. Check the patchwork is $271 / 2$ in $\times 181 / 2$ in $(70 \mathrm{~cm} \times 47 \mathrm{~cm})$.

## Quilting and Finishing

6 Make a quilt sandwich of the patchwork, wadding (batting) and lining fabric (if using). Quilt as desired. Trim off excess wadding and lining fabric to match the patchwork size.

7 To make up the pillow cover, take the two pieces of fabric for the pillow back and on one long side, create a hem by turning the edge over by 1 in ( 2.5 cm ), twice. Sew the seams with matching thread and press (Fig D).

8 For the fastening, using your sewing machine, create five equally spaced buttonholes within the hem of the lower piece (see Fig D). Sew five buttons onto the upper piece, matching their positions to the buttonholes (Fig E shows the buttons used). Note: Instead of making buttonholes, you could use a hook and loop fastening, such as Velcro, to fasten the cover and then sew on the buttons as a decorative feature.

9 The pillow has a bound edge, so the pieces are assembled with right sides out, as follows. Place the quilted patchwork right side down. On the backing, fasten the buttons into the buttonholes and then place the whole piece on top of the patchwork, right side up. Check it is the same size as the patchwork, trimming the raw edges if need be. Make sure the outer edges of all pieces are aligned. Pin or tack (baste) the layers together and then bind as normal. As you sew the binding in place it will fix the other layers together. Press the cover and insert a pillow pad to finish.

## Plaid Porch Pillow

## (Red/blue colourway)

There is also a pillow in a pretty plum/green colourway. The pillow only uses small amounts of the fabrics and if you have made the quilt, you may have some fabric left over.

- Fabric 15: two $3^{1 ⁄ 2}$ in ( 9 cm ) squares and one $3^{1 / 2}$ in $\times 6^{1 / 2}$ in rectangle - Solid light blue (120044)
- Fabric 16: two $3 ½$ in ( 9 cm ) squares - Chambray Dot denim (160057)
- Fabric 17: four 3½in (9cm) squares - Chambray Dot burgundy (160053)
- Wadding (batting): $29 \mathrm{in} \times 20 \mathrm{in}$ ( $73.6 \mathrm{~cm} \times 50.8 \mathrm{~cm}$ )
- Lining fabric (optional): $29 \mathrm{in} \times 20 \mathrm{in}(73.6 \mathrm{~cm} \times 50.8 \mathrm{~cm}$ )
- Fabric for back of pillow: $7 / 8 y d(80 \mathrm{~cm})$ - Chambray Dot burgundy (160053)
- Binding fabric: $1 / 4 y d(25 \mathrm{~cm})$ - Solid country red (120014)
- Five buttons for pillow fastening (optional) - Hometown $5 / 8 \mathrm{in}$ (16mm) diameter (400049)
- Piecing and quilting threads
- Quilter's ruler, rotary cutter and mat
- Pillow pad to fit cover

## General Notes

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## Pillow Layout and Cutting Out

1 The quilt uses just two patches - a square cut $3^{1 / 2}$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm})$ and a rectangle cut $31 / 2$ in $\times 6^{1 / 2}$ in $(9 \mathrm{~cm} \times 16.5 \mathrm{~cm})$. See Fig A for the fabrics used and Fig B for the layout and positions of the fabrics.

2 The squares and rectangles needed are given in the Materials list.
3 Cut the fabric for the back of the pillow into two pieces, each 12 in $\times 27 \frac{1}{2}$ in $(30.5 \mathrm{~cm} \times$ 70 cm ).

4 Cut the binding fabric into three strips $21 / 2$ in $(6.4 \mathrm{~cm}) \mathrm{x}$ width of fabric. Sew them together end to end and press seams open. Press in half along the length, wrong sides together.

## Sewing the Patchwork

5 Lay out all the pieces as shown in Fig B. Sew the pieces together into columns, as shown in Fig C, pressing the seams of columns 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9 downwards and the seams of columns $2,4,6$, and 8 upwards. Now sew the columns together, matching up seams neatly. Press seams in one direction. Check the patchwork is $271 / 2$ in $\times 181 / 2$ in $(70 \mathrm{~cm} \times 47 \mathrm{~cm})$.

## Quilting and Finishing

6 Make a quilt sandwich of the patchwork, wadding (batting) and lining fabric (if using). Quilt as desired. Trim off excess wadding and lining fabric to match the patchwork size.

7 To make up the pillow cover, take the two pieces of fabric for the pillow back and on one long side, create a hem by turning the edge over by 1 in $(2.5 \mathrm{~cm})$, twice. Sew the seams with matching thread and press (Fig D).

8 For the fastening, using your sewing machine, create five equally spaced buttonholes within the hem of the lower piece (see Fig D). Sew five buttons onto the upper piece, matching their positions to the buttonholes (Fig E shows the buttons used). Note: Instead of making buttonholes, you could use a hook and loop fastening, such as Velcro, to fasten the cover and then sew on the buttons as a decorative feature.
